In order to register for classes online, you need to sign up for an account with My Active Center <a href="https://www.myactivecenter.com">www.myactivecenter.com</a> which is part of the database we use at our centre called **My Seniors** <a href="https://www.myactivecenter.com">Center</a>. You must have a valid 2018 membership, the key tag you were issued by Westend Seniors Activity Centre and an email address.

**Please Note:** You **CANNOT** purchase or renew your membership online. That has to be done in person at the centre.

### Step by step on how to get started and activate your account:

- 1. Go to myactivecenter.com
- 2. Click on **New Users** on the top right hand of the page.
- 3. Please select center (Westend Seniors Activity Centre).
- 4. To activate your account you will need to enter your key fob #, email address, name and phone number. You will also need to create a secure password.
- 5. Once your account is active, as long as you hold an active membership with our centre, you will be able to register for all registered programs and classes online.


Come get in the holiday spirit while enjoying these Christmas classics!










#### Connecting With Others Never Grows Old!

1 out of every 5 seniors is lonely/isolated. The effects of isolation on a seniors health is equivalent to smoking 15 cigarettes per day! The good news is, there are resources to help reduce senior's isolation.

Seven local organizations are collaborating as part of the Pan-Edmonton Group Addressing Social Isolation of Seniors (PEGASIS) to support Edmonton seniors to reduce social isolation. By addressing a range of factors that may lead to social isolation, these organizations are connecting seniors to resources and supports:

#### **Drive Happiness**

provides affordable, assisted transportation for seniors.

**Edmonton Mennonite Centre for Newcomers** offers English language classes and help navigating community supports.

**Edmonton Southside Primary Care Network** offers phone-based classes and activities for homebound seniors.

**Greater Edmonton Foundation Seniors Housing** provides a community support program.

#### **Sage Seniors Association**
