We will be holding another drill sometime in the fall and although we know it interrupts your activity, this is something that we must do and we thank you for your cooperation.

Finally, I would like to welcome everyone, new members and returning ones to the centre. Our floors have been waxed, our carpets cleaned and we are ready for all the activities to begin. We have some wonderful activities during Open House week to help get us into the spirit of things, including a Harvest dance; fresh pie auctions and more. I look forward to seeing all of you!



The lazy, hazy days of summer will soon be over & everyone will be back into their "Fitness Fall" activities! Don't forget to include your MIND in your autumn health regime.


