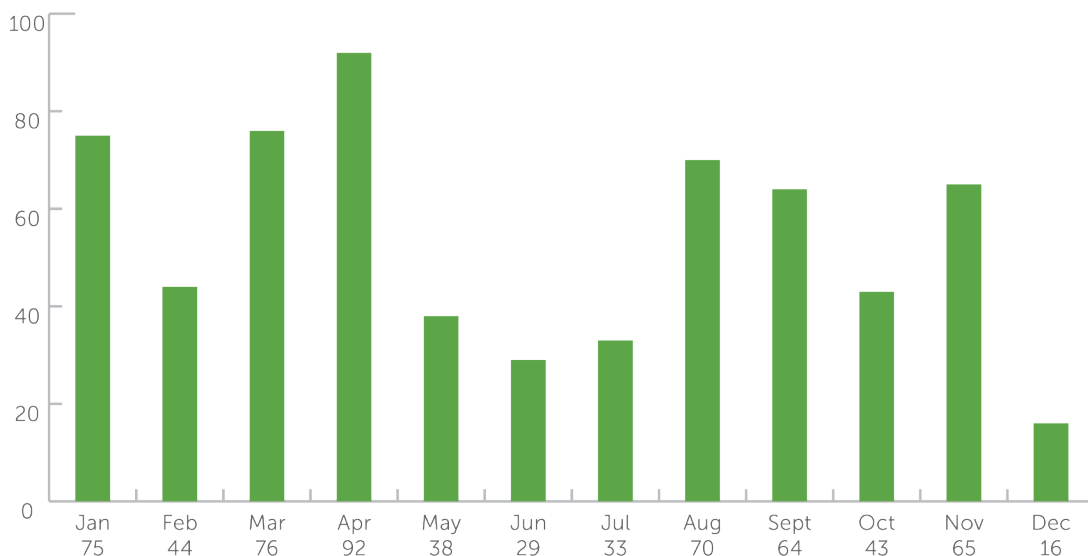

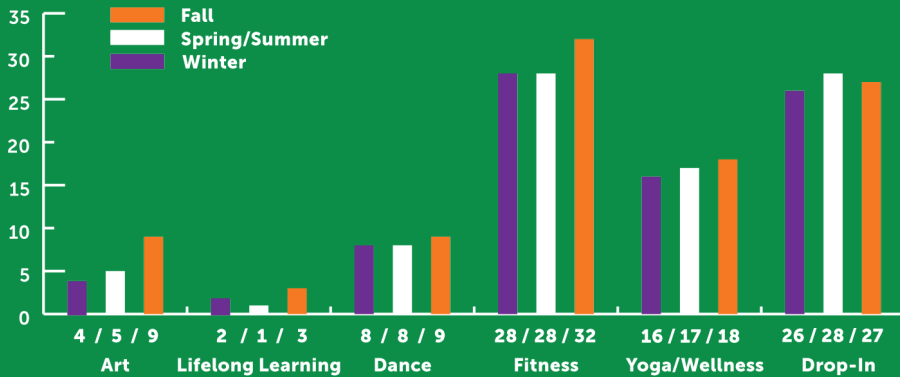

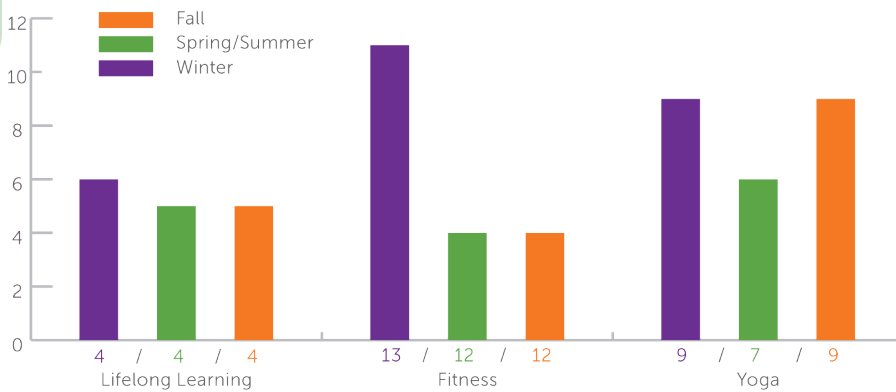

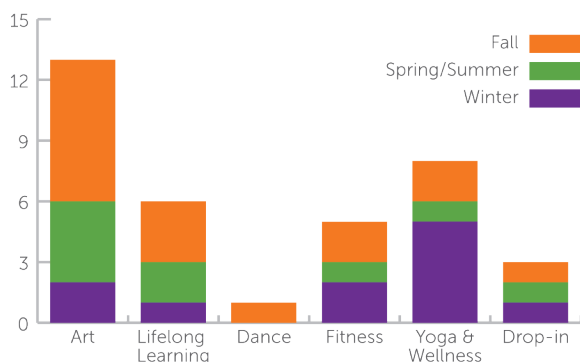

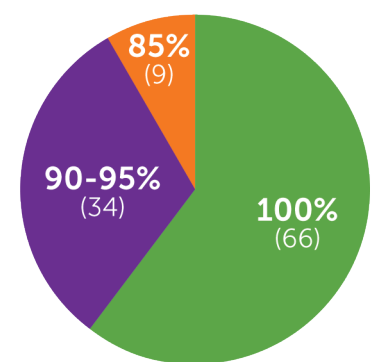

→ Needs Assessment

If you are finding that you have concerns but are not sure how to sort them out or where to go to get help, through a conversation with our Outreach team we can gather information from you to determine what resources are available to address your needs.

→ Transportation

If you are in need of transportation and not sure who to call, we can provide you with information and resources to transportation agencies or DATS if applicable.

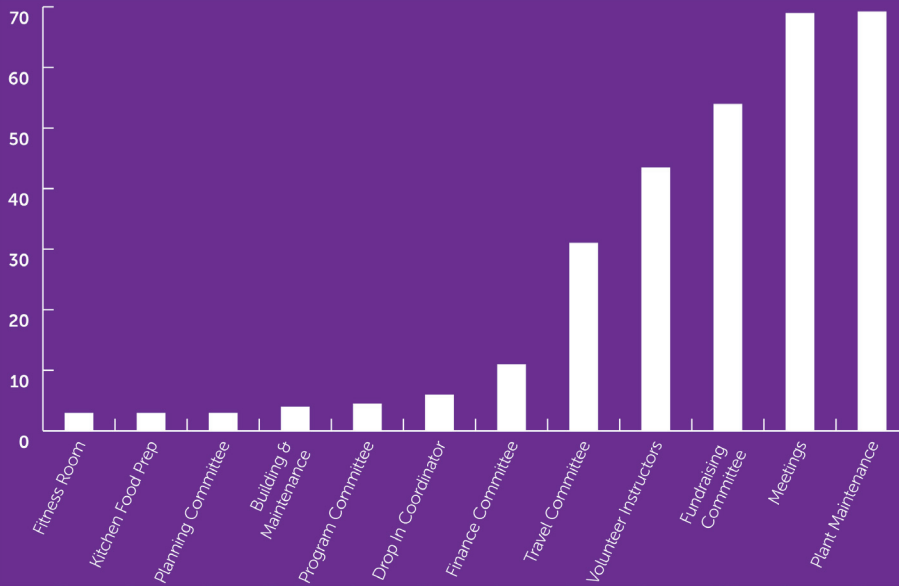
In 2022 our volunteers contributed 7159 hours of their time to the centre and in 2023 we added almost 2000 hours!

We had eight (8) volunteers contribute over 300 hours each.

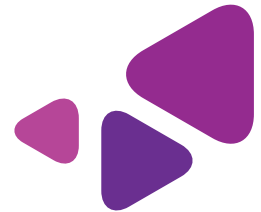

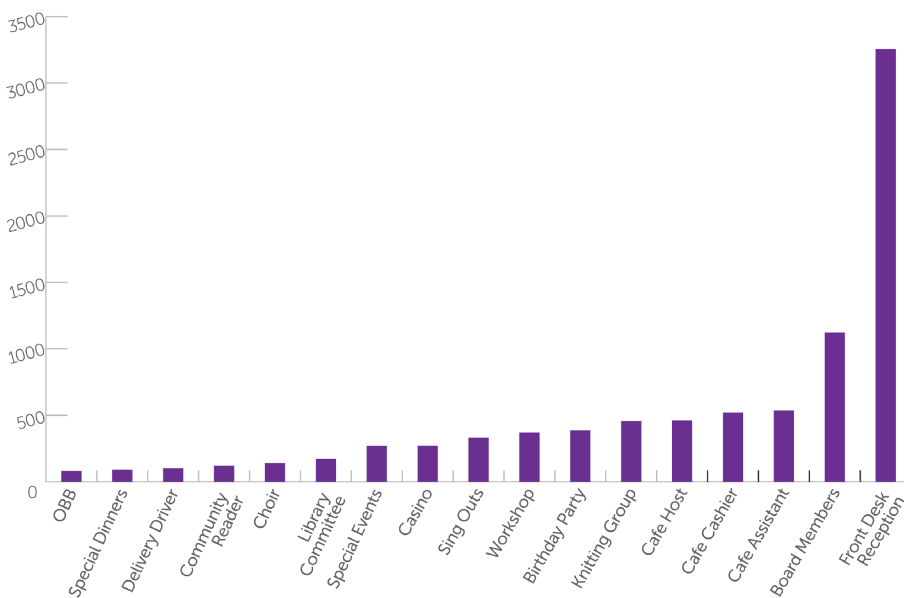
Volunteers by Group 0 - 70 Hours

WSAC Fundraising

WSAC Frozen Meal Program

The Frozen Meal Program continues to be a big part of our Outreach and Community Engagement initiatives with 1,463 orders placed by members and non members over the course of 2023.

All meals are fully cooked with fresh meat and vegetables that are bought the day before meal preparation to ensure only the best ingredients go into every meal. Many patrons say they get as much as 2 servings from our entrées and soups. Thanks to the tireless work of our volunteer drivers, and our friends at Drive Happiness, food orders are delivered free of charge.

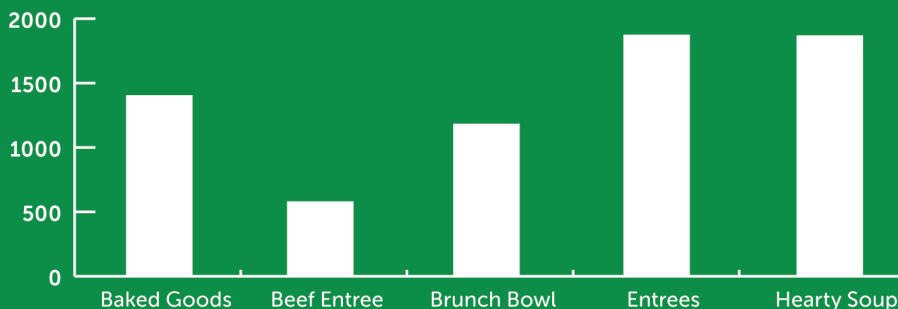

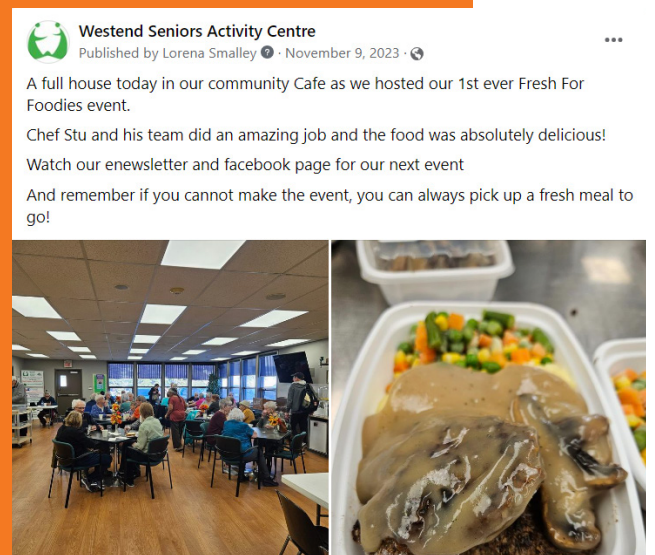

We print these in-house as needed, approximately 50-200 copies are printed each month depending on demand.
