



Before your services commence, someone will need to come to your home to complete a safety assessment






- Community safety
- Assistive devices (Grab bars, shower chair, etc)

- Tripping hazards
- Rodents or pests
- Pets
- Smoking in home
- Roommates or other people in home

Your pet will be part of your home assessment

Traditional Model

- Pets must be locked up during visits.
- Plan for have them either in a crate, outside or locked in another room during your care.

Client Directed Model

- Check your agencies pet policy Many allow pets to roam free
- Make sure to tell your agency if your pet is aggressive
- Many agencies can help you with pet care!

Technologies

While not necessary, there are technologies you can invest in to make aging in your home more comfortable

Ring Doorbell	To see who is at your door, and speak with them before letting them enter
Smart thermostat	To remotely control your thermostat, or lock it for those with Dementia
LivingWell Companion Go (Telus)	GPS tracking device for those with dementia who wander
UPS - Un-interrupted power supply	Back up battery for medical devices should the power go out

Ageney needs

- A place for your caregiver to wash and dry their hands
- If you have oral medication, agencies typically require they be bubble packed
- Some clients may need a door or medication lock box
- Staff typically need a safe place to park their vehicle
- The tools you need for them to provide care (For example, stockings if you require stocking assistance)
